Web Site of Agency Is Called Insecure

The General Services Administration has shut a Web site for government contractors after a computer industry consultant reported that he was able to view and modify corporate and financial information submitted by vendors.

The security flaw, which could have permitted contractor fraud, was reported to the agency's inspector general on Dec. 22, but almost three weeks passed before the system was taken offline Wednesday afternoon.

The General Services Administration is the federal agency responsible for procuring equipment and services, including computer security technology, making the lapse all the more striking.

"This is the government entity responsible for letting contracts for security," said Mark Rasch, chief security counsel for Solutionary, a security firm. "Clearly the people who log in would know about security."

The agency said it believed that the flaw had not been exploited by intruders or by authorized users.

It is not clear how long the problem existed. The Web site, called eOffer, was introduced in May 2004 to let companies respond electronically to requests for proposals for computer technology services and products.

Computer security consultants said the flaws could have had consequences ranging from corporate espionage to bid tampering. They also said the agency now faced the challenge of verifying the accuracy of contracting data.

The site remained inoperative yesterday evening with a posted message stating: "The eOffer system is down for maintenance. Please pardon the inconvenience, thank you."

The security flaws were discovered by Aaron Greenspan, president of Think Computer, a computer security firm based in Dallas, when he tried to register his company as a government contractor last month.

While entering data on the site, he said, he discovered that it was possible to call up documents at random and to take over the accounts of other companies by simply entering a publicly available business identification number once he had validated his own account with the system.

"Theoretically, one could have started a bidding war between Boeing and Lockheed Martin, or Dell and Gateway, or changed the terms of their existing contracts," he said.

We are writing to express concern and to seek additional information about recent reports describing a serious security flaw in a GSA website for government contractors called eOffer. This web-based application enables vendors to prepare and submit offers and contract modifications electronically. The security flaw apparently enabled any contractor that used the eOffer system to gain unauthorized access to other contractors' submissions and to conduct corporate espionage or tamper with other companies' bids. One independent computer security consultant attributed the security flaw to a series of bad decisions by the designers of the eOffer site. (See the article entitled "Web Site of Agency is Called Insecure," *The New York Times*, January 12, 2006, page C1.) We are also concerned that the flaw was discovered by a user of eOffer, rather than through a government audit, and that GSA was slow to respond when informed of the security flaw.

In a statement, GSA has acknowledged that the integrity of eOffer had been compromised, but said that GSA has shut the site down and is taking corrective action. GSA also said that it believes the problem came to the agency's attention before it caused harm to other users. The basis for that assessment is unclear, as the web site had been in operation for more than 18 months before the flaw was discovered. Because contractors enter bid and proposal information onto the web site, any disclosure may have violated the Procurement Integrity Act. But even assuming that no individual user of eOffer was injured by the disclosure of sensitive material, this incident raises troubling questions about GSA's information technology security program that may contribute to the reluctance of private-sector entities to entrust sensitive information to federal agencies generally.

E-Government initiatives in procurement and many other areas can only realize their potential for improved efficiency and customer service if companies are convinced that when they submit confidential data electronically, it will be safe from disclosure or tampering. Our homeland security efforts depend on critical infrastructure facilities sharing highly sensitive information with government agencies that use the information to counter terrorist and other threats, and to reduce vulnerabilities. Insofar as this incident at GSA will contribute to companies' resistance to sharing information with other agencies for fear that the government

The attached subject audit report presents the results of our review of GSA's system for electronic contract proposal and modification--eOffer/eMod. These two important web-based applications were launched in mid-2004 and currently allow companies to electronically prepare, submit, and modify contract proposals for select Multiple Award Schedules. Our review identifies areas where improvements are needed to ensure successful operations for the system, including achievement of FAS goals to create an interactive, secure electronic environment that simplifies the contracting process. We met with your staff on December 21, 2006 to discuss issues raised during this review including low system utilization rates and weaknesses with important managerial, operational, and technical controls, including system security controls. You have concurred with our findings and recommendations for improving eOffer/eMod, and have noted improvement actions underway. This report includes a Management Response section, which summarizes your written comments to the draft report and a copy of the comments you've provided is included in Appendix B.

In accordance with GSA Order ADM P 2030.2C, a time-phased action plan to specifically address the report recommendations and the Management Decision Record is required within 60 days of the report date. The time-phased action plan and completed Section B of the Management Decision Record should be submitted to the Assistant Inspector General for Auditing (JA), with a copy to the Audit Follow-up and Evaluation Branch (BECA).

It is important that the final actions and all management decisions responding to the report be completed within 12 months of the audit report issue date. Otherwise, the Office of Inspector General must identify in its Semiannual Report to Congress the matters on which final actions

A letter from your constituent, Mr. Aaron Greenspan, was recently forwarded to the Department of Justice by the General Services Administration (GSA). Mr. Greenspan claims that the United States Attorney's Office for the Northern District of California (USAO) recently agreed not to pursue criminal charges against him on the condition that he accept a lifetime bar from "using" GSA systems and that he not "alert" the press about the circumstances of his case. We apologize for any inconvenience our delay in responding may have caused you.

As indicated by Mr. Greenspan, after careful consideration of this matter in accordance with the *Principles of Federal Prosecution*, the USAO declined to prosecute. Because of legal and ethical considerations, we cannot discuss the specific reasons a case is declined. However, we can tell you that the USAO denies that it conditioned its declination of this matter either on Mr. Greenspan's acceptance of a lifetime bar from using GSA systems, or on his agreement to refrain from communicating with the press.

If Mr. Greenspan has questions concerning his status with GSA, or if he feels he is entitled to reimbursement from GSA, we suggest that he contact the GSA directly at the following address:





NOTICE FOR PACER FEE-EXEMPT USERS

The court would like to remind fee-exempt PACER users of the terms of the exemption and of potential issues associated with a new software application called RECAP. It was designed by a group from Princeton University to enable the sharing of court documents on the Internet. Once a user loads RECAP, documents that he or she subsequently accesses via PACER are automatically sent to a public Internet repository. Other RECAP/PACER users are then able to see whether documents are available from the Internet repository. A fee exemption applies only for limited purposes. Any transfer of data obtained as the result of a fee exemption is prohibited unless expressly authorized by the court. Therefore, fee exempt PACER users must refrain from the use of RECAP. The prohibition on transfer of information received without fee is not intended to bar a quote or reference to information received as a result of a fee exemption in a scholarly or other similar work.

NOTICE FOR CM/ECF FILERS

The court would like to make CM/ECF filers aware of certain security concerns relating to a software application or .plug-in. called RECAP, which was designed by a group from Princeton University to enable the sharing of court documents on the Internet. Once a user loads RECAP, documents that he or she subsequently accesses via PACER are automatically sent to a public Internet repository. Other RECAP/PACER users are then able to see whether documents are available from the Internet repository. RECAP captures District and Bankruptcy Court documents, but has not yet incorporated Appellate Court functionality. At this time, RECAP does not appear to provide users with access to restricted or sealed documents. Please be aware that RECAP is "open-source" software, which can be freely obtained by anyone with Internet access and modified for benign or malicious purposes, such as facilitating unauthorized access to restricted or sealed documents. Accordingly, CM/ECF filers are reminded to be diligent about their computer security practices to ensure that documents are not inadvertently shared or compromised. The court and the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts will continue to analyze the implications of RECAP or related-software and advise you of any ongoing or further concerns.










PLAINSITE Aaron Swartz Memorial Grants



The Aaron Swartz Memorial Grants

Overview

Aaron Swartz was an internet activist whose work was instrumental in creating PlainSite. He took his own life on January 11, 2013 due to events related to the wrongful criminal prosecution of his activities attempting to make public information freely available to the public.

In his memory, Think Computer Foundation is sponsoring a number of grants to improve access to public information, in cooperation with the Center for Information Technology Policy at Princeton University.

Grants 1-3: RECAP

RECAP (PACER backwards) parses expensive (\$0.10 per page) PACER dockets and uploads their contents to the Internet Archive so that they can be accessed for free. These dockets keep PlainSite up to date. Unfortunately, for various reasons, recent development on RECAP has slowed. The browser extension is only available for Firefox, and it has a few limitations.

Three grants worth \$5,000.00 each are being made available related to RECAP. Each grant is worth \$5,000.00:

- Grant 1: Develop and release a version of RECAP for the Google Chrome browser that matches the current Firefox browser extension functionality
- Grant 2: Develop and release a version of RECAP for Internet Explorer that matches the current Firefox browser extension functionality
- Grant 3: Update the Firefox browser extension to capture appellate court documents, and update the RECAP server code to parse them and respond appropriately to browser extension requests

All code must be released under the GPL license, per the original RECAP terms. Applicants can apply for multiple grants.

You can find the RECAP Extension for Firefox Github repository here and the RECAP server-side Github repository here.

We now have a development instance of the RECAP server running, which you should use for testing your code. In the Firefox extension, we define the server URL here:

Operation Asymptote

Overview

Operation Asymptote is an initiative designed to download as much of PACER as possible by spreading the burden across many individuals, none of whom need to spend anything by staying under PACER's \$15.00 per quarter free access allowance.

What do I need to do this?

- 1. You must have five minutes.
- 2. You must have a valid credit or debit card, even though it will not be charged.
- You must have a computer with internet access that can run Firefox.
- 4. You must have a PACER account.
- You must have the free RECAP browser extension.
- 6. You must download no more than \$15.00 worth of PACER materials per calendar quarter.

You can check how much you have "spent" on the official PACER site. In order to avoid being billed for the quarter, simply stop downloading when you get close to \$15.00.
